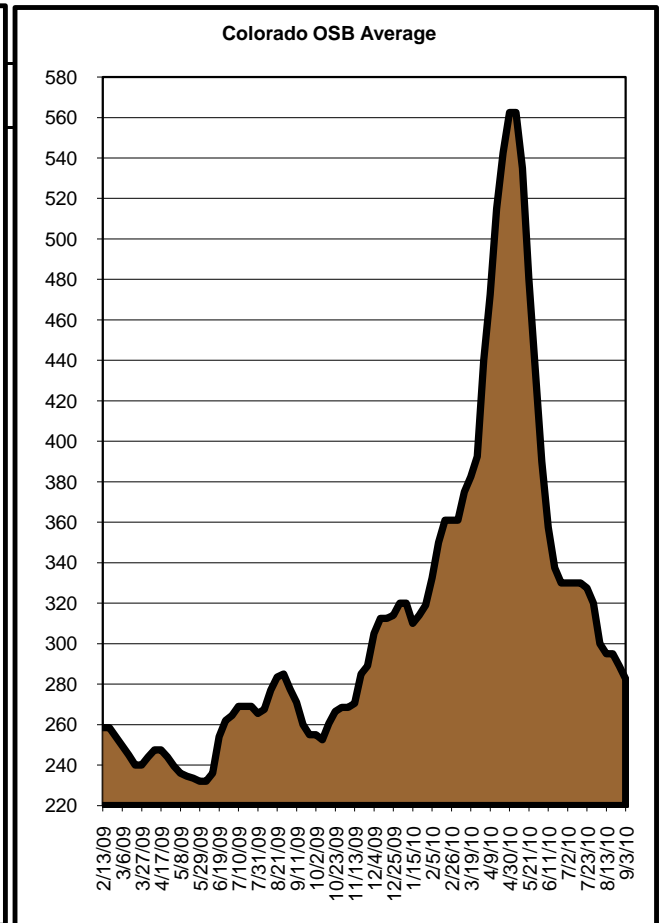
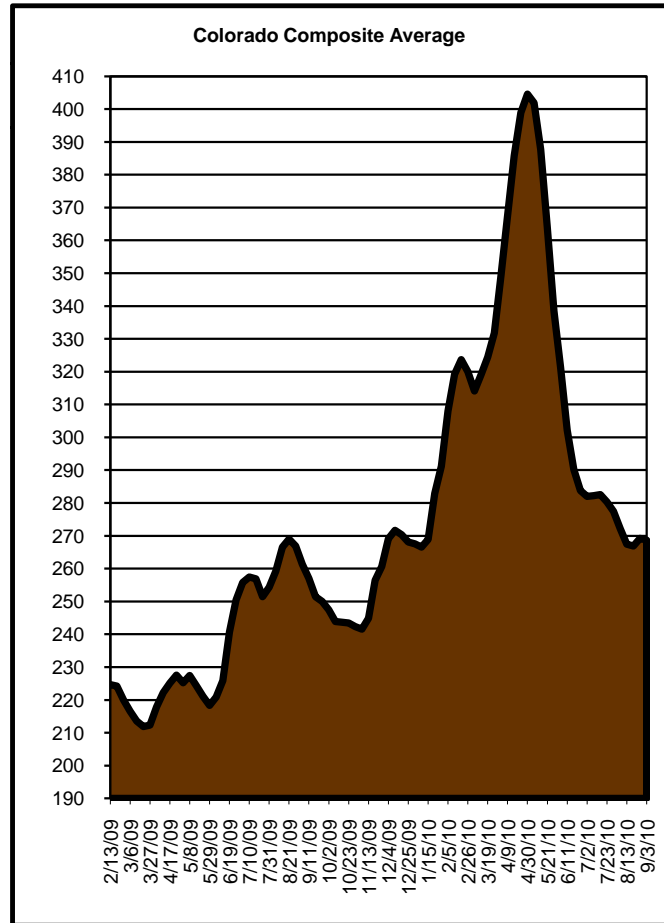

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The lumber market was quiet this week as we headed into the Labor Day weekend. SYP had the most play gaining some strength early in the week. Mill sales were slow but seemed to be about even with demand. Studs were flat in all species. Green DF prices struggled to keep the numbers gained the last two weeks but demand was thin and some producers gave up a nickel. Carloads were a hard sell in the West. Most sales came from prompt trucks into California. OSB lost ground in all regions even with early week hurricane dances from wholesalers.
